# RICHLAND COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS SEPTEMBER 4, 2018

The Richland County Board of Commissioners met on September 4, 2018 at the Richland County Courthouse with Commissioners Sid Berg, Nathan Berseth, Tim Campbell, Rollie Ehlert and Dan Thompson. Others in attendance were Administration Personnel Hage and DelVal; State's Attorney Kummer; and a Daily News Reporter.

A motion was made by Thompson to <u>approve the minutes of meetings August 7</u> and August 21; motion seconded by Berg. Berseth was absent from the Vote, the remainder voted Yes and the motion carried.

#### **DEB FLACK - DRUG FREE COMMUNITIES GRANT**

Flack reported the Health Department has applied and been awarded a Drug Free Communities Grant from the Department of Health and Human Services Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration in the amount of \$125,000/yr for five years which can be renewed one time for an additional five years; the grant will cover salary and fringe benefits - there will be no fiscal responsibility to the County. Flack requested authorization to hire an employee to manage the grant.

Following discussion a motion was made by Campbell to authorize Flack to advertise for someone to administer the Drug Free Communities Grant; motion seconded by Berg. Vote was unanimous.

In other business, Flack reported on the front desk area remodel project:

- furniture has been ordered
- an existing cabinet has been moved
- waiting on a second quote
- project needs to be complete by end of year for grant funds to be used

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

A motion was made by Berseth to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented; motion seconded by Thompson. Vote was unanimous.

- Estimated Tax Notices were mailed out last week
- Foreclosure packets will be distributed at the September 18 meeting

#### SANDY FOSSUM - BUSINESS EXEMPTION

<u>Doug and Cate Bladow, Wahpeton</u> - Application for a 5 year/100% property tax exemption for a new business project.

Doug Bladow was present - He explained they are applying for a business exemption on a proposed 17,820 square ft building to be at the hopper bin site in Center Township. The building will be used to store equipment to operate the hopper bin storage business.

A motion was made by Thompson to approve a 5 year/100% property tax exemption; motion seconded by Campbell. Vote was unanimous.

# MISC/CORRESPONDENCE

 Notice of Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement for the Fargo-Moorhead Flood Risk Management Project

A motion was made by Berg to <u>approve a Game Site Authorization for the Head of the Red Youth Activities for Gaming at Terrace Lanes</u>; motion seconded by Berseth. Vote was unanimous.

# SANDY MEYER - LADY ON THE LAKE AND THE COLONEL LIQUOR LICENSE

Sandy Meyer requested the Board consider issuing a six month liquor license rather than only a full year license. Meyer explained the Colonel Historic Barn only operates from May 1 through October 31 and the Bed & Breakfast allows visitors to bring in their own alcohol.

Following discussion a motion was made by Berseth to create a Six Month Liquor License for \$375 and Six Month Beer License for \$25; motion seconded by Thompson. Vote was unanimous.

#### **HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT**

Highway Personnel in attendance were Jesse Sedler, Lowell Bladow, Ron Hohenstern and Damon Devillers from Interstate Engineering.

<u>Helendale Private Drain</u> - Cam and Arlo Leedahl were present and Mike Gowin and Luke Lunde from WSB Engineering joined by Speaker Phone.

Cam Leedahl briefly explained the project plans -

- it is south of Leonard in Section 8 involving Co Rd 23 & Co Rd 2
- the project has been approved by the Water Resource Board
- they are working with the state for final approval
- they are working with the US Army Corp on wetlands
- they are working on permanent easements
- they are negotiating with one landowner who has not granted an easement

Sedler expressed some concerns and questions about the project plans -

- no cross sections in plans
- clear zone area/requirements
- soil borings/slope stability analysis

Sedler will discuss his concerns further with WSB Engineering after the meeting.

Sedler recommended a written Agreement be written up by the State's Attorney that should include maintenance plans for the project.

### MISC/CORRESPONDENCE

- Hage reported the <u>Election Recount</u> was held on August 27 for the Libertarian Party, there were no changes to the original Abstract.
- A refund of \$8818 was received from the ND Recorders Information Network.
- Hage updated on the <u>Compensation and Classification Study</u> PDQ's are due to HR by September 7, then Gallagher begins their process.
- Ehlert reported on a meeting he attended with Jill Breuer where <u>911 fees and State Radio Services</u> were discussed.
- Berseth reported on his recent trip to D.C. to meet with intergovernmental agencies.

## **HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT continued**

<u>Helendale Private Drain</u> - Sedler visited further with WSB Engineering, they will be providing additional slope information and we will put our stipulations on the Permit and Maintenance Agreement.

<u>Co Rd #4</u> - A motion was made by Berg to approve the Construction and Maintenance Agreement for Project SC-3912(056); motion seconded by Thompson. Vote was unanimous. The project will be bid November 9<sup>th</sup>. We will need to borrow ahead on our Federal Aid.

<u>DOT Meeting</u> - The County Meeting with DOT at Annual Conferences has been scheduled for 4:30 P.M. on October 8.

Berg <u>requested the Highway Department order a Sign for the Park Board for the Horseshoe Lake property</u> that reads "No Lifeguard on Duty - Swim at Your Own Risk".

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

<u>Weed Board</u> - Horseshoe Lake has been sprayed and cut down.

<u>Park Board</u> - A meeting is scheduled for September 17.

Public Health - Heard from Flack earlier in the meeting about a Grant.

<u>Social Services</u> - A new intern has been hired; discussed budgets and evaluations at the last Social Service Board Meeting.

## MISC/CORRESPONDENCE continued

Berseth requested a <u>Revenue Restoration Resolution</u> be on the September 18 Meeting Agenda.

A motion was made by Thompson to <u>approve the payment of bills</u>; motion seconded by Berg. Vote was unanimous.

State's Attorney Kummer reported she receives <u>updates from NDIRF on the Sadek Lawsuit</u> so the Commissioners could stop and see her for an update or hold an executive session and she could brief them all - the Board will meet in Executive Session after the Budget Hearing on September 18th.
